2023 TRBN Annual Conference | SUMMARY REPORT


Thanks to the fiscal support of Tennessee Valley Authority, and leadership from TRBN's 2023 Planning Committee, the Tennessee River Basin Network convened for their 9th annual conference at the Marriott Shoals in Florence, AL on August 23-24th, 2023. A total of 90 participants, representing 39 affiliations (see Table 1) attended over two ½ day programs that focused on networking, freshwater mussel conservation, and highlighting the diverse sectors and actions in play to safeguard our Basin's aquatic biodiversity. The sessions were structured in a variety of ways. With some being the traditional informational exchange from a single presenter, and others being highly engaging for all participants. 
